

Police call for help in Warren search

Police have renewed their public appeal for help in the search for missing WIN TV weatherman Ross Warren.

Constable Paul Ryan, of Waverley police, said detectives had no new information on Mr Warren's movements since he was last seen by friends in Oxford St, Paddington.

A friend of Mr Warren's told police he last saw him in a good state of mind about 2 am on Saturday, July 22, outside the Oxford Hotel.

He failed to arrive for work at 5 pm

that afternoon, or meet his friend at the Hordern Pavilion in Sydney. Mr Warren has not been seen since.

Concerned friends found Mr Warren's Nissan sedan at Bondi beach. His keys were found on rocks near the shoreline.

Police at first feared foul play, then suicide. They still have no firm evidence Mr Warren is alive and are treating him as a missing person.

Const Ryan said the likelihood of finding Mr Warren alive became more remote as time went on.

"We are continuing inquiries but there have been no new leads and we are making appeals to the public for help," he said.
