Police patrol coast for Warren

Detectives investigating the disappearance of WIN TV weatherman Ross Warren now believe he fell into the water off Bondi a week ago, but can't say how.

Refusing to rule out any possibility, they would say only that the area where Mr Warren's car keys were found was a treacherous rock formation, very wet and very slippery.

"It is not difficult to imagine some-one slipping," a spokesman said.

The police air wing is carrying out regular patrols of the east coast looking for the missing media personality, but detectives are still unwilling to discount the possibility that he may be alive.

Yesterday they released for the first time the full details of the events leading up to Mr Warren's disappearance in the early hours of last Saturday morning.

Mr Warren, 24, apparently left work at the WIN TV studios on the night of Friday, July 21, and travelled to Albert St, Redfern, where he intended to stay with accountant Craig Ellis.

Police say it was a fairly regular practice for Mr Warren to stay with Mr Ellis about every second weekend.

Details released of last known hours

Mr Warren had a meal, telephoned a number of people, and then left the flat about 11 pm to go to a bar in the Oxford Hotel, Taylor Square.

Mr Warren apparently met up with another WIN TV employee, had a number of drinks, and visited other bars before parting company about 2 am outside the Oxford Hotel.

A police spokesman said the pair arranged to meet at a function at the Hordern Pavilion on Saturday night.

This friend described Mr Warren as being in a good state of mind when he was last seen heading east in Oxford St.

Then on Sunday Mr Warren failed to arrive at work at 5 pm and did not contact anyone. Mr Ellis spoke to management and they became concerned.

At 8.15 pm Mr Warren was reported missing, but there were no fears for his safety at that time.

Two friends decided to make their own inquiries and, using their knowledge of Mr Warren's habits, went to Bondi and found his Nissan sedan.

On Monday morning the friends spoke to Paddington police telling them of their find and a description was circulated, saying fears were held for his safety.

Friends later searched rocks near the sea path from Bondi to Bronte and found Mr Warren's car keys.
