INFORMATION: From 1400 hrs on Monday, 31/10/2016, Det. MORGAN met with Mr. INGLEBY at his Otford home.

During 1989/90, Mr. INGLEBY was a (fmr Detective) uniformed Sergeant based at Bondi P.S. He gave evidence at the Taradale inquest which concluded in 2005.

Enquiries conducted during 1989 by Mr. INGLEBY related only to the death of John RUSSELL (23/11/1989): he was not involved in investigations relating to the disappearances of either Giles MATTAINI (1985) or Ross WARREN (July 1989).

In relation to the RUSSELL matter, Mr. INGLEBY indicated the following:-

- \* he suggested investigators make contact with former D/S/C Patrick GLEESON, who had also worked at Bondi P.S. at the time of Mr. RUSSELL'S demise.
- \* he suggested that a media appeal/reward announcement might be considered incorporating the involvement of Alan RUSSELL- brother of the deceased. Mr. INGLEBY stated that he had watched the recently-screened 'Deepwater' documentary on SBS television, and believed that Alan RUSSELL- brother of the deceased had come across as very genuine: and his involvement may further appeal to potential witnesses.
- \* stated that he personally possessed no crime scene or post-mortem photographs relating to the RUSSELL matter, and that he had 'borrowed' such photographs from staff at Bondi Detectives whilst making his statement/s. He had returned these photographs after completing his statement.
- \* suggested checking the (East Sydney) crime scene office for the filed 35 mm negatives of such photographs.
- \* he suggested that (ISRAPS) might be utilised in assembling a thorough overview of the Marks Park area.

Mr. INGLEBY'S recollection and record-keeping is significant. He provided police with typed and handwritten notes and 5 X of his Police notebooks from the relevant period.
