ISSUE:

Request to rename the 'Engagement & Intervention Unit/Bias Crimes Unit to 'Engagement & Hate Crime Unit', (EHCU), Anti-Terrorism & Intelligence Group, Counter Terrorism & Special Tactics Command (CTSTC).

BACKGROUND:

Since November 2018, the Bias Crimes (BCU) portfolio has sat within the Engagement and Intervention Unit (EIU), CTSTC conducting monitoring and analysis of bias motivated incidents occurring in NSW. Prior to this the Unit sat within the Policy and Program area of the New South Wales Police Force.

COMMENT:

There are significant operating synergies between the engagement and intervention and bias crimes activities. The BCU has moved beyond the remit of monitoring and analysis and now the BCU works proactively with the EIU in operationally engaging individuals and groups whose activities fall within a bias/hate crime cohort as well as the broader sphere of operations within the Anti-Terrorism & Intelligence Group.

It has been identified via informal interactions with operational Police and the broader community that there is confusion regarding the definition of 'bias' which is likely impeding the recording of incidents by Police and perception of the Police role in responding and investigating bias motivated incidents.

Subsequently, approval has been granted by DTI to make several changes to reporting via WebCOPs to enhance the reporting of events and information reports to further promote the elimination of confusion regarding the definition of bias crime with operational police and the community. (D2019/1083926)

It is requested that the Engagement & Intervention Unit/Bias Crimes Unit be changed to a single unit called 'Engagement & Hate Crime Unit'.

Currently, the new offence within the NSW Crimes Act 1900 - 93Z, Offence of publicly threatening or inciting violence on grounds of race, religion, sexual orientation, gender identity or intersex or HIV/AIDS status, is reported by the media and legal institutions as hate crime legislation which targets hate speech.

This highlights the importance of changing the Bias Crimes title to Hate Crimes to ensure the promotion of the unit's role and responsibilities is consistent with the messaging both within the NSW Police Force and broader NSW Government and community.

RECOMMENDATION:

Submitted for consideration of approval and implementation of the Unit name change.


