RESUME OF INQUIRIES REGARDING THE MURDER OF JOHN GORDON HUGHES ON THE 5 MAY, 1989 - FOR THE PERIOD ENDING THE 10 JULY, 1989.

Police in Charge : Detective Constable 1c PLOTECKI, RCSS Homicide

Facts : As per outline of previous resume 13.5.89.

Situation

Information recieved from the Scientific Section that as a result of tests, it has been established that all the blood located in the flat of the deceased, including that on the knife found next to the body, belonged to HUGHES. All the blood located in the lane and at the enterance to the block of units did not match the blood of HUGHES and in fact some of the blood varied in grouping from other blood located in these areas outside the units.

This information would indicate that there are no positive connections between the blood in the lane and at the front of the units, to that of the deceased and the flat (crime scene) itself. A full report is to be forwarded to the Scientific Section and will be made available to investigators.

This information would indicate that at the present time, the persons BREWER and KINGSBEER should not be considered as primary suspects in this matter at this time. As stated in previous resumes, both these person on the information available have no connection with HUGHES and have person verifying their accounts of injury. The information would also indicate that any further requests for blood from suspects is unnecessary.

Information has also been recieved by Kings Cross Police from two anonymous sources that a person named "Wayne", currently believed by Kings Cross Police to be Wayne YOUNG b. possibly of

Maroubra, was seen with blood on his hands in the vicinity of the victims unit. One of these items of intelligence claims to have seen this person in Fitzroy Gradens, at 1.30am on the 6.5.89 the other coming out of the units of the deceased at the same time. At this time Kings Cross Police have still not interviewed YOUNG.
