1. This statement made by me accurately sets out the evidence which I would be prepared, if necessary, to give in court as a witness.

2. This statement is true to the best of my knowledge and belief and make it known that if it is tendered in evidence I shall be liable to prosecution if I have wilfully stated in it anything which I know to be false or do not believe to be true.

3. My date of birth is [REDACTED]

4. On Wednesday 3 May 1989, I was rostered to perform Highway Patrol duties with Constable Lynce in the Bathurst area. At about 10.15PM acting on information received we patrolled the Great Western Highway in the vicinity of the Denison Bridge, where I observed a white Commodore sedan registered No.173AGC travelling in a westerly direction. The vehicle commenced to cross the bridge from east to west and it was seen to cross onto the incorrect side of double unbroken separation lines and continue across the length of the bridge on the incorrect side of the road.

5. The vehicle was stopped and the driver spoken to a Miss Kerrie Anne Stanton of [REDACTED] Sylvania. Miss Stanton was then submitted to a roadside alco test which proved positive and was then arrested and conveyed to the Bathurst Police Station where she underwent a breath analysis test which returned a reading of 0.310. Miss Stanton was then formally charged with the offence of Drive with High Range Prescribed Concentration of Alcohol.

6. At 11.45PM Miss Stanton was bailed to appear at the Bathurst Local Court. At 11.50PM I drove Miss Stanton to [REDACTED] Upfold

I then returned to the Police vehicle which was out on the roadway and with Constable Lynch left the area.
