The defendant JONES was then taken to an 5. interview room within the building and was supplied with a drink. In company with Detective PLOTECKI I was present when he said to JONES, "Before we commence I want you to understand that you are not obligeded to answer any of my questions or say anything unless you wish to do so but whatever you say may be used in evidence. Do you understand that?" JONES said, "Yeah I know my rights." Detective PLOTECKI said, "What is your full name?" JONES said, "Ian Stuart JONES." Detective PLOTECKI said, "Where are you living?" , the Wesley Mission, just up the JONES said, " road." Detective PLOTECKI said, "How long have you lived at your present address?" JONES said, "I've been there about four months." Detective PLOTECKI said, "Are you working at the present time?" JONES said, "Yeah, Aerolift as a plant operator." JONES said, "Yes."

Detective PLOTECKI said, "My questions and any answers you give to those questions will be recorded in type by Detective Sergeant SMITH as the interview takes place. Do you understand that?" JONES said, "Yes."

Detective PLOTECKI said, "At the conclusion of the interview you will be given the opportunity of reading through the interview and you may sign it if you wish. Do you understand that?" JONES said, "Yeah."

Detective PLOTECKI said, "At the conclusion of the interview you will also be given a complete copy of our interview."

8. Detective PLOTECKI then asked the defendant a number of questions and those questions together with the defendants answers were recorded in type by me in the form of a record of interview. At the completion of the interivew it was removed from the typewriter and handed to the defendant who appeared to read each page of the interview. It was then returned to the typewriter and Detective PLOTECKI then asked the defendant Witness: ..

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a number of questions in relation to that interview and those questions together with the defendant's answers were also recorded on the typewriter by myself. Detective PLOTECKI then said to JONES, "Are these additional questions and answers recorded correctly?"

JONES said, "Yeah."

The defendant JONES then initialled a number of typing errors in the interview and then signed each page of the interview. Detective PLOTECKI then said, "Will you please write the words, "SYDNEY POLICE CENTRE" and today's date beneath your signature on the last page of the interview?"

JONES then wrote these words and then dated the interview. Detective PLOTECKI then said, "Will you please write the words, "I have received from Detective PLOTECKI one complete copy of this twenty one page record of interview on the last page of the interview and sign your name again beneath that receipt?" JONES said, "Righto." JONES then wrote a receipt on the last page of the interview and signed his name again. Detective PLOTECKI then witnessed the defendant's signatures. Detective PLOTECKI then left the room and returned a short time later with a copy of the interview and gave the defendant that copy.

9. Detective PLOTECKI and I then left the room and I had a brief conversation with him. I then returned to the room with the defendant. A short time later Detective PLOTECKI returned to the room with Inspector COUNSEL and Detective PLOTECKI said, "This is Detective Inspector COUNSEL, he is now going to ask you some questions concerning the interview we have just completed." Detective PLOTECKI and I then left the room. A short time later Inspector COUNSEL came out of the room and handed Detective PLOTECKI a number of documents. Detective PLOTECKI and I then returned to the interview room and Detective PLOTECKI said, "You will shortly be taken to the charge room where you will be charged with the murder of John Gordon Hughes. Do you understand that?"

10. A short time later the defendant was taken to the Homicide Squad Office and several forms were completed. A short time later the defendant was then taken to the charge room at the Sydney Police Centre where he was charged. During the course of the interview the defendant was shown a number of documents as well as items of clothing.
