5. During the time that Mr PLUNKETT was absent I heard the accused say in a loud tone, clearly heard by all the Police present, " What the fuck did you let that bastard from Homicide into the bedroom for?" I heard Miss STANTON say, " Calm down, I'm sorry." I heard the accused JONES say in a loud tone of voice, " Ya dopey bitch ya should never have let him near the place. All because of you I'm in all this shit."

- I then spoke to Constable TAYLOR nearby and entered the interview room area where Miss STANTON was and said, " Are you discussing the murder charge with Ian." She said, " Yes. " I said, " Would you come with me. " I then said to the accused, " Listen Ian, you don't discuss your other matter with Miss STANTON, as she is a prosecution witness." He said, " I'm sorry, I won't talk about it to her anymore, can she come back in." By this time Miss STANTON had left the room, and spoke to her in the corridor of the court house.
