The deceased had been drinking heavily on the day of 12 October with his friend Russell LONGMORE. On the 12th instant, Paynter had been arrested and charged at Bega Police Station with shop stealing from Liquorland. The two then went to Tathra Hotel and continued drinking till 10.30pm when Longmore left the Hotel. Inquiries with John Robertson from the Tathra Hotel reveal that the deceased did not leave the Hotel until 12.15am on 13 October, 1989.

About 5.30pm on 12 October, 1989 Police were called to Shelley Beach at the bottom of a Cliff at Tathra which is in close proximity to the Hotel. There they spoke to [redacted] 150 of the tathra Caravan Park who had discovered the body of the deceased. The deceased was observed to be laying on his right side at the bottom of the 50meter cliff. His body was found with his shirt pulled over his head with his arms in the sleeves and his jeans and underwear pulled down near his knees. Abrasions were noted on his back and face.
