

## Special Commission of Inquiry into LGBTIQ hate crimes

## Supplementary statement of Caitlin Healey-Nash

## 16 November 2023

This statement made by me accurately sets out the evidence that I would be prepared, if necessary to give to the Special Commission of Inquiry into LGBTIQ hate crimes (**the Inquiry**) as a witness. This statement has been prepared from my own knowledge and also from perusing the records of the Inquiry. The statement is true to the best of my knowledge and belief.

- 1. My name is Caitlin Clare Healey-Nash. My address is known to the Inquiry.
- 2. I am employed as a solicitor by the Inquiry.
- 3. In the course of my duties, I have reviewed and conducted inquiries in relation to the death of Andrew Currie, who died on 12 or 13 December 1988 at Nolan Reserve, North Manly.
- 4. On 2 February 2023, I made a statement in relation to the inquiries into the death of Mr Currie. This supplementary statement outlines the further results of investigative steps taken since my previous statement.

Inquiry made with NP

- On 12 October 2023, I wrote to NP, who was GB's partner at the time of Mr Currie's death. In his third statement to the Inquiry, GB stated that Mr Currie visited NP and him at their residence on Manly Vale on 12 December 1988 (the night before Mr Currie's death).
- 6. I advised NP that the Inquiry would be grateful to receive any information from her that may assist the Inquiry in more fully understanding the circumstances surrounding Mr Currie's death, and invited her to speak with Inquiry staff about Mr Currie's matter.
- 7. As at the date of this statement, I have not received a response from NP.
- 8. I do not have access to a telephone number or email address for NP.
