

## Special Commission of Inquiry into LGBTIQ hate crimes

## Statement of Janice Walker

## 3 February 2023

This statement made by me accurately sets out the evidence that I would be prepared, if necessary, to give to the Special Commission of Inquiry into LGBTIQ hate crimes ("the Inquiry") as a witness. The statement is true to the best of my knowledge and belief.

- 1. My name is Janice Walker. I was born in 1960.
- 2. My address is known to the inquiry.
- 3. I am the sister of Brian Walker. Brian was born on 17 April 1962. Our parents are Yvonne Schmidt and Cedric Dacey. They are both deceased. Our father died when I was very young. My mother subsequently married John Schmidt. My youngest brother, David Schmidt, was born in 1971from that relationship.
- 4. Brian went to Bexley Primary School and later Mount Druitt High School. Brian didn't finish high school. He left home when he was around 16 or 17 years old.
- Brian did not have regular employment. He sometimes did odd jobs and liked to help people out.
- Brian was a 'happy go lucky' person and he accepted others on face value. He was very trusting. Brian always had lots of friends and was quick to befriend others. I didn't know many of his friends, but my mother did.
- Brian enjoyed artistry and was very talented at drawing, particularly cartoons. He drew a mural on the wall in our home in Bexley of three monsters riding on motorbikes.
- Brian was a bit of a wanderer and drifter. He did not have a set address; he would stay with friends and move between houses. Sometimes I wouldn't see him for months on end and then he would contact me out of the blue.
- In terms of Brian's sexuality, I didn't think Brian was interested in men because I had previously seen him with girlfriends.
