

RECORD OF INTERVIEW BETWEEN DETECTIVE SERGEANT G.D. HOGGETT AND GAVIN DAVID CUTHBERT HELD AT THE WAVERLEY POLICE STATION ON THE 19 TH OCTOBER, 1981.

Present.... Detective Sergeant G.D. Hoggett  
Gavin David Cuthbert.

Time commenced.... 10.5 a.m.

Q.1. As I have told you, I am investigating the death of Gerald Cuthbert at Paddington, and I intend to ask you some questions in relation to this matter, do you understand that?

A. Yes.

Q.2. What is your full name?

A. Gavin David Cuthbert.

Q.3. What is your date of birth?

A. [REDACTED], '59.

Q.4. Where were you born?

A. I was born in Fiji, I went over to New Zealand when I was three, I was brought up over there.

Q.5. Where do you live?

A. [REDACTED] Alice St, Newtown.

Q.6. Where do you work?

A. Nally Plastics at St. Peters, I'm a factory hand.

Q.7. Are you related to Gerald Cuthbert?

A. Yes, I'm his full brother.

Q.8. Can you tell me the last time you saw Gerald?

A. Yes, I saw him last Saturday, he came over to my place by himself and he was telling me about this \$140-00 that I owe [REDACTED] for a telephone call at his flat, and I told him I was going to pay [REDACTED] back this week. I'm not sure exactly what time it was when he came over, but I think it would have been about 2 o'clock in the afternoon, I'd had a big night on the drink on Friday night, and he woke me up when I was in bed. He wanted our uncles address, Uncle Peddy, who lives at [REDACTED] Albert St, Marrickville and I gave it to him and Gerald said he wanted to see him, they got along real well eh. He was there for about 10 or 15 minutes, and when he left he took a blanket, a sort of pink one, which belonged to [REDACTED]. About half an hour later he came back and said he couldn't find Uncle Peddy's place, and then we had a bit of an argument about the money I owed [REDACTED], and we just had a brotherly argument about this, and he left. That was about the last time that I saw him.

Q.9. Do you know how Gerald was travelling when he came to your place on Saturday?

A. He would have come by train. I'm not sure, but I think thats how he would have got there.

Q.10. When did you come to Australia?

A. About July, this year. I hadn't seen Gerald for years until I came to Australia, and since I've been here I've seen him a few times but not a lot.

Q.11. When you last saw your brother did he mention any problems or enemies he may have?

A. No, Gerald don't tell me his problems eh., he don't talk about anybody to me anyway.

Q.12. Would you have any ideas as to who may have been responsible for his death?

A. No, other than Ted, who he once lived with at Paddington, I don't know who Gerald knocked around with. I know he lived at the Y.M.C.A. Really I'd like to help you, but there's nothing much I can tell you. He used to come to my place a few times, only when he wanted something, money or something, or just have a talk. That was mainly when Uncle Peddy lived there.
