<p>18/10/81 <i>Sunday.</i></p>	<p>DEATH OF GERALD LESLIE CUTHBERT, BORN 27/7/54 AT PADDINGTON THIS DATE.</p> <p>About 6.15pm this date [I212] born [redacted] 43 and Simon Richard CANT, born [redacted] 62, together with other people returned to [I212] flat situate at [redacted] Stephen Road, Paddington where they discovered the body of Gerald Leslie CUTHBERT, born 27/7/54 of Room [redacted] Y.M.C.A. Pitt Street, Sydney. The body laying face down on [I212] bed. A subsequent examination by Dr. Brighton, G.M.O. showed that his throat had been cut and that there were numerous stab wounds to the back. Dr. Brighton was of the opinion that the deceased died as a result of the wound to the throat. A full post mortem examination will be carried out at 10am on the 19th instant.</p> <p>[I212] and CANT were interviewed and stated that the deceased had previously shared the flat with [I212] and that [I212] and the deceased had had an homosexual relationship which ceased when the deceased left the unit in July, 1980. [I212] and the deceased remained good friends and the deceased retained a key to the unit and was a regular visitor, often letting himself in when [I212] and CANT were absent.</p> <p>[I212] stated that he last saw the deceased on Thursday 15th instant, when the deceased had tea at the unit with him and CANT. During the evening, [I212] informed the deceased that he and CANT were going to a Church meeting in Nowra on Saturday morning for the weekend and the deceased was invited but he declined to go. [I212] and CANT did in fact attend the meeting in Nowra, leaving on Saturday morning and returning at the time they found the deceased. [I212] stated that the deceased was in the habit of frequenting places where homosexuals gathered and would often solicit other males.</p> <p>Anthony FARRELL, who shared a room at the Y.M.C.A. with the deceased was interviewed and he stated that he last saw the deceased about 7.30pm on Friday the 16th instant, when the deceased informed him that he intended to stay for the weekend at [I212] unit. He did not see the deceased again.</p> <p>An examination of the flat showed that the deceaseds clothes were alongside the bed on the floor, the deceased being [redacted].
