open shirt, jeans and white shoes.

Police also found number of cigarette packets near the body.

"We believe the de-ceased was with some-one shortly before the time of death," a police spokesman said.

Bondi detectives are appealing for informa-tion over the death. A transsexual who knew the dead woman said she was a loner who worked in clubs a

few years ago. "She kept to herself fairly much and was not that happy," she said.
