1. This statement made by me accurately sets out the evidence which I would be prepared, if necessary, to give in court as a witness. The statement is true to the best of my knowledge and belief and I make it knowing that, if it is tendered in evidence, I shall be liable to prosecution if I have wilfully stated anything which I know to be false or do not believe to be true.

2. I am 48 years of age.

3. In 1983, I started to work for the Taxation Department at the Centrepoint office in Sydney. I remember that Carl STOCKTON was the Training Officer for Assessing.

4. About three years later, I ran into Carl STOCKTON again at the Hunter Street Office. He worked in an area called Priority Control. I worked in the area next door, which was the Management area. We used to drink at a hotel across the road, I don't remember what it is called. One night I saw that he had a few bruises on the side of his head and I said, " What happened to you?" and he said, " I am a homosexual, it happens occasionally. In those days homosexuality was looked upon in a different light than it is today.

5. I also remember that a very good friend of his who also worked for the Taxation Department was talking about Carl behind his back. He was cracking homosexual jokes and I said to him that he shouldn't be dumping on Carl behind his back. I didn't tell Carl about this.

6. I moved to Chatswood in December 1987 and I never saw or heard of Carl STOCKTON again until my girlfriend asked me if I knew a Carl STOCKTON. I told her that I did know him and she said to me that he had been murdered and that it would be on Crimestoppers show that night. I watched the programme and I contacted Crimestoppers with this information because they said on the programme that they did not have a motive for the murder.
