> 1. This statement made by me accurately sets out the evidence which I would be prepared, if necessary, to give in court as a witness. The statement is true to the best of my knowledge and belief and I make it knowing that, if it is tendered in evidence, I be liable to prosecution if I have wilfully stated anything which I know to be false or do not believe to be true.

2. I am 25 years of age.

3. I am a casual bar attendant at 'Bar Cleveland' which is at the corner of Bourke and Cleveland streets, Surry Hills.

4. On Tuesday the 5th of October 1996, I was working both the front and back bar from 5.00pm.

5. About 1.45am on the 6th, a guy came in to the back bar where I was cleaning up. He said, "There's an old guy that's collapsed outside, I think you should call someone." this guy went back outside and I went into the front bar and told Brent who was the manager that night.

6. Brent and a customer went out onto Cleveland St, and came back in a couple of minutes later with an elderly guy who had his arm in a sling. He looked really dazed and he was walking but Brent was helping him. Brent sat the **qld** guy in **q** chair

near the door and he sat with his head slumped forward. I got him a glass of water and gave it to the customer who went out to get him.

7. Brent rang Missionbeat and because the others were with him I kept cleaning up.

8. I recognised the old man as a regular customer. I've also seen him around in the local area. He was drinking in the bar earlier that night and I think he came in about 7.00pm. He was drinking schooners of Resches and stubbies of Coopers and left at about 11.30pm. He seemed slightly intoxicated - he is usually just a steady drinker and I've never seen him really drunk. He usually gets 'take-aways' before he leaves (longnecks of 'Resches' or 'Coopers'). I didn't serve him any that night but I did see him in the bottle shop as he was leaving so someone must have served him.

9. The Missionbeat van came in about five minutes and spoke to him for a while before they took him away.
