- On 6th November, 1996, I attended to a male patient, Carl Stockton, who 5. was admitted via the Emergency Department of this hospital after being brought in by Campbell House staff.
- On admission he was complaining of a headache, suffering from amnesia, 6. and was disorientated in place although not time or person.

The injuries sustained were fractured right clavicle, right black eye, cerebral CT scan showing a comminuted skull fracture extending from posterior parietal region into the vertex with some displacement. There are areas of intra cerebral haematoma in the right temporal pole, both frontal poles, both posterior parietal regions and near the vertex on the right.

The treatment was hourly neurological observations, prophylactic loading dose of phenytoin, insertion of indwelling catheter, and transfer to St. Vincents Hospital for further neuro surgical management.

- 7. The patient was transferred that same day to St. Vincents Hospital Emergency Department.
- 8. I am not experienced or trained in forensic medicine to give expert advice on how these injuries were sustained.
