On this date interviewed and obtained 28-5-76 statement from Mr. John SPANSWICK, 4pm. of Papakura, South Auckland, New Zealand. SPANSWICE is the father of Mark STEWART @ SPANSWICK and at 11.45am. this date attended the City Morgue, Glebe where he identified the body of the deceased as that of his son. Mr. Spanswick Snr. had not heard from his son since June, 1975 when the son left N.Z. to go to Brisbane where he ostensibly had work. A card was received from Brisbane to the effect that the son had obtained work and was O.K. STEWART @ SPANSWICK had been a member of the R.N.Z. Navy from about June, to December, 1974 when he deserted. This is undoubtedly the reason for the name change. Mr. Spanswick suggested that the reason his son was in Manly could have been the fact that whilst they resided in Fiji the family had a number of holidays in Manly and the Shelley Beach-Fairy Bower area was frequently visited by the deceased and family. The Deceased was also very keen on rock climbing. The father had no knowledge of suicidal tendencies by his son and undoubtedly Mark was walking around the cliff face area and probably slipped and fell.
Mr. Spanswick took possession of the body of the deceased and has made burial arrangements. Property also handed to him and receipt obtained. W.G.Cooper, Detective Sergeant
