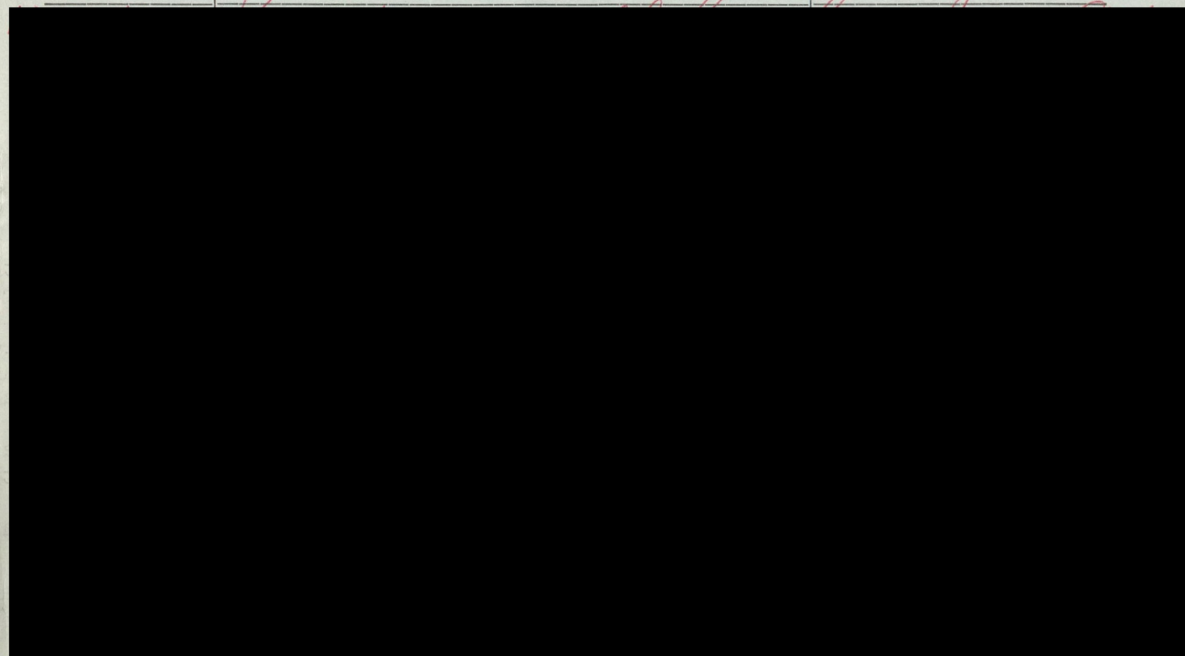

UNIDENTIFIED YOUTH FOUND AT THE FOOT OF FAIRY BOWER HEADLAND.

Record.

About 10 a.m. this date Mr. Colin Richard McGUIRE, of [redacted] Dee Why, found the deceased body of a youth about 15 years of age at the foot of the Fairy Bower Headland Manly. Mr. McGuire contacted Police and the scene was attended. It was apparent that the youth that the youth had either jumped or fallen from the cliff top, about 150 feet above. The Rescue Squad under Sgt. Phay attended and removed the body to the cliff top. Life was pronounced extinct by Dr. Adams, Resident Medical Officer, Manly Hospital, prior to removal to the City Morgue, Glebe.

ENTRY 524 ON 11.5.76.</p> <p>Inquiries have been at the local waterbeard depot regarding employees of the description of the deceased without result. The local employment office was also supplied with the description for the information of their staff. These inquiries were necessary as a piece of paper bearing the numbers 7.20 11.5.76 was found in the deceased pocket and it was felt that it may have been an appointment time.</p> <p>The missing persons Bureau was contacted and informed of the circumstances and description.</p> <p>The body was photographed at the City Mortuary this date and Fingerprints were taken. Constable Derwisha of that Section has informed that the deceased is not on record.</p> <p>The wrist watch worn by the deceased was opened by Jim Keepman, Jeweller, of [REDACTED] Manly, and the following repair mark was found; T 7933 HJIK.</p> <p>The number has been given to Sgt. 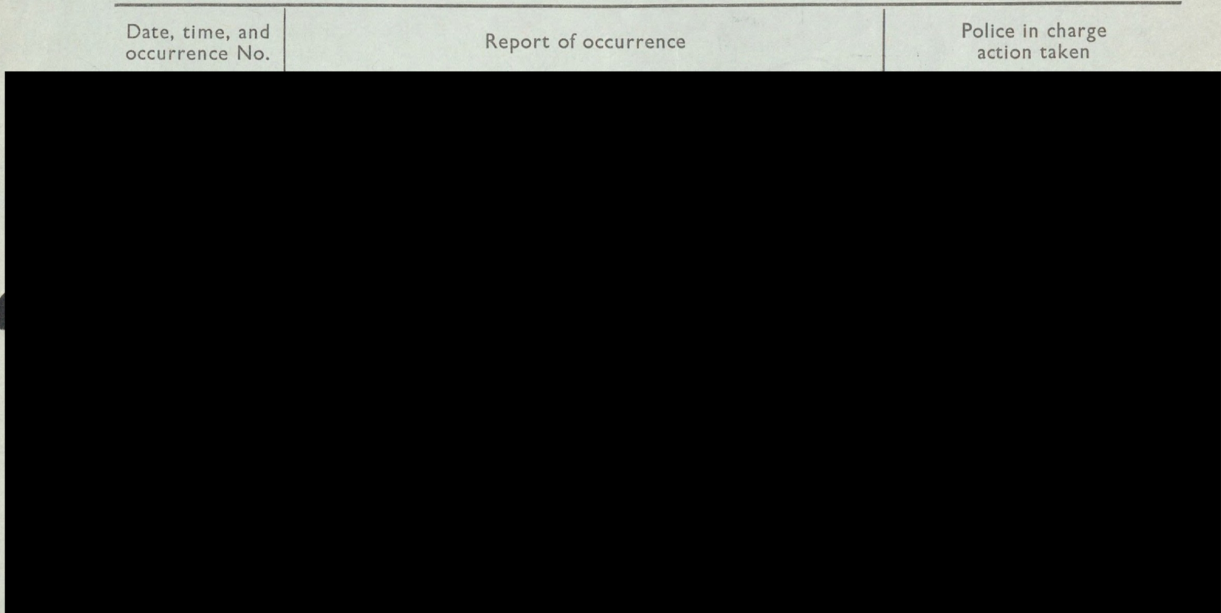

541	<p>From inquiries made on 11.5.76 at the Sydney Hilton Hotel re unidentified male person found at Fairy Bower on 11.5.76, I received a telephone call from Mr David Ford Security Control Officer of the Hilton Hotel, stating that a young male person answering the description of the above had booked into the Hotel on the 9.5.76 and was due to leave on 11.5.76, but had not been seen since the 10.5.76 and that the persons passport and personal effects were still in the room No.3177. In company with Constable Lizdenis I attended the Sydney Hilton Hotel and there spoke to Mr William Muirhead Security Control Officer who showed Constable Lizdenis and Myself the room and contents. As I attended the scene and viewed the body of the deceased I identified the body with the pictures in the passport, with telephone permission of Sgt. 1/C Thompson took possession of the passport and property M.P.B. 25/156 The person named in the passport is Mark STEWART D.O.B. 18.7.57 passport No. C766306 (British) and address of same in QLD. drivers licence [redacted] Upper Edward Street, Brisbane 4000. Telephone message No.1910 has been sent to Brisbane via CIB inquiry office as to a positive identification and to inform relatives. Inquiries continuing.</p>	<p>✓</p>

RECORD.</u></p> <p>On this date interviewed and obtained a statement from Mr. John SPANSWICK, of [REDACTED] Papakura, South Auckland, New Zealand. SPANSWICK is the father of Mark STEWART @ SPANSWICK and at 11.45am. this date attended the City Morgue, Glebe where he identified the body of the deceased as that of his son. Mr. Spanswick Snr. had not heard from his son since June, 1975 when the son left N.Z. to go to Brisbane where he ostensibly had work. A card was received from Brisbane to the effect that the son had obtained work and was G.K. STEWART @ SPANSWICK had been a member of the R.N.Z. Navy from about June, to December, 1974 when he deserted. This is undoubtedly the reason for the name change. Mr. Spanswick suggested that the reason his son was in Manly could have been the fact that whilst they resided in Fiji the family had a number of holidays in Manly and the Shelley Beach-Fairy Bower area was frequently visited by the deceased and family. The Deceased was also very keen on rock climbing. The father had no knowledge of suicidal tendencies by his son and undoubtedly Mark was walking around the cliff face area and probably slipped and fell.</p> <p>Mr. Spanswick took possession of the body of the deceased and has made burial arrangements.
