Thank you for your letter dated 21st November, 1974, received today.

I notice that Mark is still at large and you do not seem to have made any progress in discovering his whereabouts.

When I received your cable I immediately placed a 'phone call to you, but as you were at sea I spoke to Commander Raeburn and told him that we had no knowledge of our son's whereabouts. Five or six days later I attempted to speak to you again but was told that you were still at sea. I told the N.L.O. Fiji that we had no knowledge of the boy's whereabouts and he undertook to inform you of this. I repeat that we still do not know of his whereabouts, in fact, we have taken the necessary steps to have him apprehended should be arrive in Fiji.

I do not know to what problem you are referring as neither you nor Mark had advised that there was one.

We expect to be in Auckland in the middle of December when we shall be getting in contact with you.

It is noted that you say you will advise us if you receive any information re Mark's present activities or whereabouts and I can assure you that we will let you know if we discover anything.
