MICROSCOPIC EXAMINATION:

BRAIN:

MIDBRAIN: No abnormality seen.

MEDULLA: A little focal perivascular blood beneath the fourth ventricle on the left side.

RIGHT FRONTAL LOBE: A very little subarachnoid blood.

RIGHT THALAMUS: No abnormality seen, a small focus of perivascular blood medial to the thalamus.

RIGHT CEREBELLAR HEMISPHERE: Some post mortem autolysis centrally, no other abnormality seen.


LEFT HIPPOCAMPUS: No abnormality seen.

RIGHT MAMMILLARY BODY: No abnormality seen.

RIGHT PUTAMEN/GLOBUS PALLIDUS:
 Neurones in the globus pallidus, particularly, have eosinophilic cytoplasm; a few organisms without inflammatory reaction are present.

SPINAL CORD: CERVICAL) Minimal subarachnoid blood,
 THORACIC) vacuoles are a little prominent
 LUMBAR) in the white matter.

COMMENT: Post mortem change, a very little subarachnoid blood.
