About 2pm on 2.12.80 Walter John BEDSER who had been working alone in his antique shop in Darcy Street, Parramatta was heard to scream out and a short time later staggered out of his shop, crossed the arcade and collapsed on the floor of the fruit shop opposite. He was covered in blood and it was subsequently found that he had suffered a stab wound to the upper left side of the chest and a deep stab wound to the lower right side of the chest. Bedser died a short time later in hospital from these wounds. An examination of the premises revealed a bloodstained knife on the floor of the shop, behind the counter.
