1. I am a married woman and I live at the above address with my family. I am a teacher at the Arthur Phillip High School, Smith Street, Parramatta.

2. About 1.40pm this date I was walking along Darcy Street, Parramatta towards Church Street. As I was passing the arcade which leads from Darcy Street through to Church Street, I heard a series of crashing and grunting noises, it sounded to me as if there was a fight going on. I stopped walking and looked in the doorway of the Antique shop which is situated at the beginning of the arcade. As I stopped a man ran out of the shop into Darcy Street. When I saw that he was running, he was actually hurrying. As he passed me he shrugged his shoulders and threw his arms out and said, "It's nothing to do with me, I didn't do anything." He then went off down Darcy Street towards Church Street. Within a few seconds another man came out of the shop and saw that the flesh on his left forearm was hanging in tatters and his right fist was clenched to his chest. I saw that the front of his clothes were saturated with blood. This man said, "Get the ambulance." The man was doubled over on his hunches and Phillip from the fruit shop came out of his shop. I ran into the dress shop and they gave me some towelling. When I got back to the man he had been moved to the front of the fruit shop. A number of people were assisting the man who appeared to be unconscious. Within five minutes the Ambulance arrived and treated the man. I then gave my name to Phillip from the fruit shop and continued on my way.

3. I have not seen the man who ran from the shop before. I would say that he was 38 to 40 old, 5'9" to 5'10" tall, he had a chunky nugetty build, round face, medium complexion, he had dark hair which appeared straight, medium length, perhaps slightly receding at the front. He did not have any accent, I would say that he was an Australian. He seemed to have on a khaki shirt and trousers such as delivery men wear.
