- I am a married woman and I reside at the above address with my husband and two children.
- About 9am today I went shopping in the Parramatta area. Around about 2pm today I went to the Bus Stop in Darcy Street, Parramatta. I sat down on the seat diagonally opposite the Antique Shop in Darcy Street and about 50 -60 feet up the street past the shop, on the opposite side of the road from the shop.
- 3. I was talking to the lady next to me and I was looking down the street towards the Antique Shop. Suddenly I heard mens voices calling out loudly but I couldn't distinguish what the voices were saying. This drew my attention to a man running very fast from the direction of the Antique Shop. He was running at full pelt with arms swinging and long strides. He was running in the direction of Church Street. I saw him as far as the corner then a man dropped his briefcase in front of me and ran across the raod to the Antique Shop and he distracted me and I didn't see the man who ran from the shop after that.
- 4. I could only see the man who ran from the shop briefly from the side then the back. I would describe him as being in his early to mid 30's, about 5'9" tall, shiny very dark wavy hair, this was very noticable because his hair looked well groomed and brushed back.
