
STATEMENT in matter of:

1. I am a married woman and I live at the above address with my family.

2. About 2pm on Tuesday the 2nd December 1980 I was in Parramatta shopping. About that time I was walking along Darcy Street. I had turned out of Church Street and was walking towards the Railway Station. I was on the side of the street where the shops are. When I was about ten meters into Darcy Street I noticed a man running towards me. When I looked at this man face he appeared to have a look of urgency on his face. When he was about ten meters from me I heard him call out " Get an ambulance. " He said this twice. It was rather a loud voice he used. There wasn't very many people in the street at the time and he ran past me on my right side. I didn't turn to see where the man went. I thought perhaps he was running to a phone. I continued on along Darcy Street and when I got to the fruit shop which is at the beginning of the arcade I w saw another man in the doorway of the fruit shop. He was sitting on the ground with the top of his body hunched over. I saw that he had a bad wound to his left arm. There were a number of other people there helping the man. I stayed there a short time, I left just before the ambulance took the man away.

3. I have never seen the man who ran past me before. I would say that he was about 35 years old, about 5' 10 " tall, I would say that he was a bit on the heavy side, he appeared to have the complexion of a man who had been working out in the sun . His hair was brown in colour, it appeared to be thinning at the front. He had it parted from the left to the right, I had the impression that he combed that way to conceal a bald area. He was clean shaven. I don't recall his dress very well, I think it was a brown colour, like the colour of cardboard boxes. I am not sure if he had a coat on or whether his top matched the pants. I am quite sure that he spoke with an Australian accent.
