	<p>About 6.30pm on the 3.12.80 at the Parramatta Police Station, interviewed NP58 17 old born, [redacted] of [redacted], phne. [redacted], a close friend of the deceased.</p>	
	<p>NP58 informed us that he met the deceased about 2 years ago, when he was attending the Power Coaching College, Parramatta. The College was in the same arcade as the deceased's shop. The deceased asked NP58 if he would like to work for him. NP58 started work for the deceased a short time after this, doing deliveries for for him. The deceased paid him \$2.00 per hour for the work.</p>	
	<p>After about 2 or 3 months of NP58 starting work with the deceased they formed a relationship. The deceased use to have oral sex with NP58 in a room above his shop. The deceased also visited the home of Sam about 2 or 3 times per week, he would have coffee or a meal. Also NP58 would mow the lawn at the deceased's home. The deceased also gave NP58 a number of presents including a digital watch and clock radio. He would also pay NP58 the sum of \$10.00 for oral sex. This would take place approximately once a month.</p>	
	<p>On the 16.4.80, NP58 bought a 1973 Ford Escort Sedan, No. [redacted], the money for this vehicle, \$2,900.00 was lent to NP58 by the deceased on the understanding that the money would be returned when the Father of NP58's compensation claim was paid. NP58 alleges that this money was repaid to the deceased. NP58 intended to buy another car about 4 or 5 months ago, the deceased offered to lend NP58 the sum balance of the money for the car which consisted of about \$4,000.00. NP58 went to a Car Yard in Burwood and saw a Gemini. He took the deceased to the Car Yard to view the car and the deceased then told NP58 that he wouldnot lend him the money. NP58 and the deceased had an argument and NP58 told him to 'Piss Off'. NP58 stated that this was the last time he saw the deceased.</p>	
	<p>NP58 would also travel with the deceased whilst he bought and</p>

They would travel to Bathurst, Tamworth and Singleton.</p> <p>The Escort which NP58 bought was stolen from the Belfield R.S.L. where he was attending a Greek Disco on the 27.9.80. This vehicle was burnt out. Mr. Doug SAMUELS, claim manager for the N.R.M.A. Insurance, Parramatta, received an anonymous phone call prior to this happening which he believes was from the deceased stating the NP58 had paid a person \$400.00 to burn his car. The insurance company is still at present investigating this matter.</p> <p>NP58 doesnot fit the description of the suspect. His father is at present on Workers' Compensation for a back injury. He had not at this stage been interviewed, however from inquiries it is doubtful if he is similar to the suspect.</p> <p>NP58 stated that other persons would visit the Antique Shop, these included [redacted] 147 [redacted], phe. [redacted] (Interviewed) and another boy named 139, who resides at [redacted]. NP58 also stated that a number of school kids would hang round the shop, including both girls and boys.</p> <p>NP58 is at present employed at I.P.E.C.
