3.12.80.	<p>INTERVIEW OF [147]</p> <p>On the 3rd December, 1980, interviewed [147], born [redacted], of [redacted]. He is a full time student at Granville Technical College studying for an Electronic and Communication Certificate.</p> <p>[147] stated that he commenced working on a part time basis for Walter John BEDSER at 4 Darcy Street, Parramatta, at the beginning of 1979. He was paid \$2.00 per hour until about April, 1980, when the rates were increased to \$3.00 per hour. His employment finished about 2 to 2½ months ago. He worked for the deceased on a casual basis and the deceased would ring him at his home and ask him to go to the shop the following day. The work performed by [147] consisted of unpacking and storing property at the shop. His employment terminated when the deceased did not ring him at his home. He spoke to the deceased about this and was informed that there was no work. About 6 weeks ago he saw the deceased with a young ½ Leb. boy who was introduced to him as [135] and [147] then formed the opinion that [135] was working for BEDSER and that was the reason his services were no longer required.</p> <p>He stated that when he commenced working for the deceased NP58 [redacted] was working for the deceased. ([redacted] previously interviewed.) NP58 left about 6 months ago and as far as [147] is aware no other person was employed there to replace NP58.</p> <p>[147] denied that any homosexual activity had taken place between the deceased and himself. He stated that the deceased had made no homosexual approaches to him. They had discussed homosexuality and [147] informed the deceased that he was straight and not interested in that sort of activity. He stated that after NP58 had left the deceased employee he, [147], had gone to Wollongong with the deceased to pick up some furniture. They had stayed overnight at a motel but spent the night in separate beds. He stated that NP58 often went to the country with the deceased.</p> <p>[147] stated that the only male persons he knew who went to the deceased shop were NP58, previously</p>	SMITH & MCHUGH.

	<p>INTERVIEW OF [redacted] 147 .PAGE 2.</p> <p>mentioned; [redacted] 145 who did work at the deceased's home and who was also mentioned by [redacted] NP58 who also cut grass at the home of the deceased (No further information available); and [redacted] 144 who attended [redacted] in the early part of 1979 and who now lives somewhere at [redacted]. [redacted] 144 lived in [redacted], and would be about [redacted] years of age.</p> <p>[redacted] 147 stated that school children waiting for buses which leave Darcy Street opposite the shop of the deceased also frequented the shop but he did not know any of them.</p> <p>He stated that he had attended the home of the deceased on one occasion only and that the deceased had visited his home on numerous occasions, mainly to pick him up to go to work at the shop. BEDSER would also call at [redacted] 147 ' home if he was in the area and would stay there for varying periods of time.</p> <p>[redacted] 147 stated that the deceased was a very 'soft' person who would not argue with anyone. He would go out of his way to avoid arguments.</p> <p>[redacted] 147 does not bear any resemblance to the description of the suspect.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">SMITH.</p>
