5.12.80	INTERVIEW OF [139] RE MURDER OF WALTER JOHN BEDSER.	SMITH & McHUGH.
	<p>About 7.50am on the 5.12.80 attended [redacted] and interviewed [139]. [139] born [redacted]. [139] stated that he first met the deceased about 10 years ago when the deceased lived in a flat at the rear of premises next door to [139], in [redacted]. About 3 years ago [139] went to work for the deceased in the shop and also mowing lawns for him on the weekends. The deceased would pay [139] at \$3.00 per hour for this work.</p>	
	<p>About 2 years ago [139] went overseas for 12 months. Upon his return after about three months he again resumed work with the deceased. He went on a number of trips with the deceased at weekends to buy and sell Antiques. These trips were day trips. They would go to places such as Appin, Goulburn and South Coast.</p>	
	<p>He was aware that the deceased was a homosexual and stated that when he resumed work with the deceased after returning from overseas, he would allow the deceased to masturbate him. He ceased to work for the deceased about 3 or 4 months ago and has not seen him since.</p>	
	<p>The only other boy that he knew the deceased to be having sexual relationships with was [NP58]. He was aware that the deceased had bought [NP58] a car. He also informed us that the deceased had purchased an S.I.R. 5000 Torana and had given it to [NP58] for him to use. This vehicle was purchased from Peter Brooks a racing driver. The deceased had told [139] some time ago that [NP58] had stole jewellery from him. He could not assist as to the identity of the offender, off his murder.</p>	
	<p>[139] is a Storeman at Merrylands Produce Store, 274 Merrylands Road, Merrylands. He owns a 1973 Holden Sedan White in colour No. [redacted]. His Father [redacted] was seen and does not fit the description of the offender and there are no other male relatives.</p>
