	<p>On the 8.12.80 at the Parramatta Police Station, interviewed [NP61], 49 old of [redacted], Parramatta.</p>	
	<p>[NP61] informed us that she has known the deceased for about 2 years. The deceased has been coming to the home of the Family of NP61's for that period of time. Her brother NP58 had been working for the deceased for that period of time, however he has not worked for the deceased for the past 3 or 4 months and the deceased hasn't visited them during this time. [NP61] stated that she has only been to the shop of the deceased on one occasion, this being about 3 months ago when she was coming home from work. She went in the shop to have a talk to John, (the deceased.) [NP61] stated that she never borrowed any money from the deceased and she was unaware of her family borrowing any money from him. She stated that the deceased treated her like a sister. He never made any advances towards her although she is an attractive young girl.</p>	
	<p>When he visited the Family of NP61's he was mostly alone, although on one occasion he brought his 22 year old nephew. After NP58 stopped working at the Antique Shop about 3 months ago she only saw the deceased on one occasion and that was when she was coming home from work. The deceased was walking to his car and they both acknowledged one another and the deceased drove off.</p>	
	<p>[NP61] is employed by the department of Defense and has so been employed for the past 4 months. Prior to this she was employed by the Federal Police Force at Redfern as an interpreter for a period of 3 months. [NP61] could not assist any further with this inquiry.</p>
