8.12.80	<p>INTERVIEW OF JAMES KELAHER RE MURDER OF WALTER JOHN BEDSER.</p> <p>About 11am on the 8.12.80 attended premises at Raffin & Kelaher Auctions, 16-20 Larkin Street, Camperdown, phne. [REDACTED]. There spoke to James KELAHER, phne. [REDACTED].</p> <p>Kelaher informed us that the deceased has been coming to his Auctions for the past 2 to 3 years. He only attends what is called the Fine Arts and Antique Actions which are held on the Monday after Long weekends and sometimes at night. Kelaher would ring the deceased and inform him when these Auctions were to be held. The reason he would do this was that the deceased was a good buyer at the Auctions.</p> <p>Kelaher stated that the deceased was a loner. He would come to the Auctions and sit up the back. He wouldn't speak to any of the other dealers and he would bid privately. He has only come to the Auctions twice with other people. About 4 months ago he was accompanied by a small Greek youth, solid build with dark curly hair, which fits the description of NP58. On the 3.8.80 he was accompanied by his mother. On this occasion he bought an Electric Dolls House. The last time he attended the Auction was on the 9.11.80. On this occasion Kelaher thinks that he had another young greek boy with him. This boy is possibly 135.</p> <p>Kelaher suspected that the deceased was a homosexual however the deceased didnot make any advances towards him.
