11/12/80	<p>INFORMATION RE BEDSER MURDER FROM GREGORY JAMES BOYLTON</p>	<p>WAKEFIELD AND PESZCZUK</p>
	<p>About 2.50pm on 11/12/80, Gregory James BOYLTON, born [redacted] of [redacted] Phone. [redacted], a Manager of the Cooks Magic Market Place, Westfield Shoppingtown, Parramatta Phone; [redacted], attended Parramatta Police Station as a result of newspaper articles concerning BEDSER's murder.</p>	
	<p>BOYLTON is an antique dealer and works for Alan COOK of [redacted] Phone. [redacted] who owns the Parramatta Store.</p>	
	<p>BOYLTON is described as 5/11 tall, flabby build, dark brown hair, freckled complexion and when spoken to was wearing loose fitting clothes and is no doubt the person described by [redacted] NP58 in running sheet 28/4.</p>	
	<p>BOLTON informed me that he had known the deceased since 1976 both professionally as an antique dealer and as a friend but denied having any sexual relations with BEDSER. BOLTON also stated that BEDSER was ruthless in business and had a bad name in the antique trade because of his ruthlessness and used to travel to country areas on buying trips.</p>	
	<p>BOLTON would not admit to being a homosexual but by his manner and dress it is obvious that he is and he admitted that the deceased was homosexual and was having an 'affair' with [redacted] NP58, who is previously mentioned. He also informed us that the deceased had told him that the deceased preferred 'ethnic boys and used to place advertisements in the window of his shop for boys to help out in the shop after school and he was subsequently seduce them. According to BOLTON, this was a distasteful practice on the deceased's part.</p>	
	<p>BOLTON worked for the deceased on one occasion for a few days about one year ago. He also stated that Mrs. [redacted] NP59 owed the deceased some money, approximately \$300 and had discussed this with the deceased and the deceased had informed him of an alleged threat to the deceased made by the woman and BOLTON suggested that the deceased tape record the conversation with her in the future. ....2.</p>

	<p>The last time that BOLTON saw the deceased was at 3 pm on the Monday, the 1.12.80 when he went to the shop after having to leave his shop because of a bomb hoax that was in the Westfield Plaza. At the time BOLTON had \$3000 on his person and was going to leave it in the deceased's safe but changed his mind. He had a conversation with the deceased and later went back to his shop in the Westfield Plaza.</p> <p>BOLTON also mentioned a man who is a hairdresser in the Parra Mall, George St., Pyramatta that was having an affair with the deceased in recent times, but did not know his name.</p> <p>BOLTON was questioned about his movements on the 2.12.80, the day of the murder and he informed me that he was off duty and he was spending the day with a woman friend of his Sarah DOHERTY of [REDACTED] and they both went shopping and he went to Marrs Fabrics, Darcy St., and bought some materiel lengths and went to his shop to check with the shop assistant who was working for him that day. They then went to the Westower Tavern and then went home to Baulkham Hills, arriving about 2.30pm. The motor vehicle they were travelling in was parked in the Westfield Car Park and when they left the car park they travelled along Campbell St., into Church street and travelled north along Church St., and during the time they were passing the Darcy St., intersection, he did not notice anything out of the ordinary.</p> <p>On Monday when he was at the shop, he stated that he saw two men, who were both 'ethnic' seated in a car outside the shop. One of the men was known as Noel who was well built.</p> <p>BEDSER was also in the habit of buying flashy american motor cars and changed them frequently.</p> <p>BOLTON came forward after reading an account of the murder in the local paper but waited for one week before coming to the Police. Further inquiries to be made re his movements of the day of the murder.</p>
