	<p>On the evening of 19/12/80 attended premises at [REDACTED] and interviewed Mr. Simon DIKRANIAN re further information about suspects for the Bedser murder.</p>	
	<p>Mr. Dikranian had been interviewed previously, and he contacted this station and requested he be shown the identikit so that he could compare it with the male he had seen on the 1/12/80 in the shop of the deceased.</p>	
	<p>Mr. Dikranian feels that the person he saw had a rounder, heavier face than the one in the identikit, the nose was pointer, the man had a big chest, 5/9 - 5/10, curly dark brown hair, possible Lebanese, wearing shorts, and slippers, about 30 old, he was with another man who was taller and thinner but Mr. Dikranian didn't take that much notice of him. The only reason he noticed the first man was that he was having a discussion with the deceased, and this man walked behind the counter and interrupted their discussion and spoke to the deceased (Mr. Dikranian can not remember what was said) and then the two men went into the office. Mr. Dikranian feels that the deceased wasn't happy with the two men and he feels that they had some sort of argument, but he can't remember anything further.</p>	
	<p>This version of his story changes with what he said when first interviewed in that now the man was possibly Lebanese and before he was an Australian.</p>	
	<p>Mr. Dikranian is the owner of the Two Star Deli, Shop 341, Top Level, Westfield Plaza, and from appearances he would also be a homosexual, though he stated that he did not know anything about Bedser's private life, only knowing him through their respective businesses. He stated that Bedser would give him a discount on purchased he made from the antique shop, and he would do the same for Bedser from his Deli.</p>
