	<p>About 10.20am on 26/12/80 spoke to 142, born [redacted] of [redacted]. He has just completed the Higher School Certificate Examination at Macquarie Boys High, North Parramatta and is currently unemployed. He is not known at the Fingerprints. 142 is an associate of NP58 and 142 is mentioned in R/S 26/4 26/10 - 26/11.</p>	
	<p>142 stated that he has known NP58 since his days at Primary School but has really been associating with him for the past 10 months. He knew that NP58 did work for the deceased and was paid for his work. He denied knowing that NP58 was involved in homosexual activities with the deceased. He stated that NP58 had told him that BEDSER was a homosexual. 142 stated that about two years ago, he learned that NP58 was stealing money and jewellery from BEDSER's shop. The stolen jewellery NP58 would dispose of at the School by selling to various students. He stated that at one stage, BEDSER found out about the stealing matters when 140. Possibly of [redacted], informed BEDSER of NP58's activities so far as the stealing was concerned. BEDSER apparently gave 140 money to buy some of this stolen jewellery from NP58 and then return same to BEDSER. It appears that NP58 found out about the plan and purchased some cheap jewellery which he sold to 140, who in turn gave it to BEDSER, thus BEDSER's plan to catch out NP58 failed. 142 stated that he had seen NP58 with up to \$50-00 in cash when NP58 was about 15 years of age and thought it strange. 142 stated that he knew of incidents when NP58 would take BEDSER's car, a Station Waggon without BEDSER's knowledge and later return it to a parking position at the rear of the shop. 142 stated that he didn't know BEDSER or ever visited his shop. At one stage, NP58 told 142 that his family had received some 'legal papers' about \$500-00 that was owed BEDSER by NP58. NP58 allegedly visited BEDSER and got him</p>

	to withdraw the legal process concerning the debt. He believes that the \$500-00 he mentions is still owed to BEDSER. He stated that he doesn't know any more concerning this alleged money.	<u>WAKEFIELD/PESZCZUK</u>
	[ 142 ] stated that shortly after the murder occurred, he and NP58 went to visit friends in [redacted] where [redacted] resides. [redacted] brother [redacted], who resides in [redacted], [redacted]'s wife [redacted] were present during a discussion at that house when [ 142 ] mentioned having heard about BEDSER's murder. NP58 commented to the effect that he was happy that BEDSER was dead but also commented that it was a 'slack' way for him to have died. When asked to explain the meaning of the last mentioned comment, [ 142 ] stated that BEDSER was a person who didn't like violence etc. and interpreted NP58's comment regarding 'slack' as meaning it wasn't a fitting way for BEDSER to die.	
	[ 142 ] also stated that one [ 146 ] was a good friend of NP58 and believes that this person [ 146 ] at one time went away on a trip with the deceased, possible to Bathurst. This occurred some two years ago.	
	[ 142 ] was questioned as to his knowledge of any Greek or other ethnic male Hairdressers in the Parramatta area that may be known to NP58 or BEDSER. He stated that one [ 136 ] who works at the Hairdressers in the Parramall off George Street, Parramatta is known to NP58 and possible to BEDSER. (see R/S 74/1 - interview of Gregory BOLTON who mentions that Deceased was having a homosexual affair with hairdresser who works at Parramall)	
	[ 142 ] was also questioned as to his knowledge of an Insurance Claim respecting NP58's motor vehicle. See R/S 26/1. [ 142 ] admitted knowing that the Claim was false and having lied to the NRMA when interviewed by them on 25/11/80. He stated that on the night of 27/9/80, he was picked up by NP58 at his home in the Ford Escort Sedan

	<p>██████████. They were to attend an ethnic disco at the Bedford R.S.L. Club that night. Whilst en route to those premises, NP58 told 142 that his vehicle was going to be stolen from near the Club that night by a mate of his. NP58 said that he had a duplicate key for the ignition which he was going to leave under the dashboard. He was also to leave the driver's door unlocked. 142 asked questions of NP58 about his intentions regarding the car. NP58 said that this mate of his, named Garry, an Australian with blonde coloured hair, who lives in the ██████████ area, was going to do the job. NP58 stated that in return, Garry was to keep the radio, seats and a black and chrome sports type steering wheel, which was in the boot of the car. The car was to be stripped and then burnt. Garry was to have assistance to carry out the job from his friends. NP58 was going to make a false claim and use the money to purchase a Holden SLR Six cylinder car. Garry either works with NP58 as a mechanic or attends Granville Technical College with NP58. He is believed to be a motor mechanic. NP58 asked 142 to lie for him at the interview with the insurance company. 142 stated that he didn't hope to gain anything from his assistance to NP58 other than helping out a mate. No action has been taken against 142 in connection with the apparent false insurance claim at this stage. 142 was allowed to leave and conveyed to his home. His father ██████████, was spoken to and the situation explained. 142 142 has indicated that he is prepared to assist Police in the murder inquiry and will pass on information should it come to hand.</p>	<u>WAKEFIELD / PESZCZUK</u>
