9.1.81.	<p>CECIL JAMES BULL INTERVIEWED RE INFORMATION RE BEDSER.</p>	WAKEFIELD / FESZCZUK.
	<p>About 9.10pm on the 8.1.81 I interviewed Mr. Cecil James BULL born [redacted], together with his wife, Margaret Elsie BULL, born [redacted] of [redacted] at the Merrylands Police Station and BULL informed me that about 18 months ago he had been speaking with the deceased, who was a friend of his and his wife, and the deceased informed him that the deceased's mother had been threatened by some person and he, Bull, was not to ring the house where he and his mother lived, after dark, nor was he to call at the house as was often the practise, because of the alleged threat. BULL and his wife are in the furniture restoring business at the rear of their home and they often sold pieces of furniture to the deceased to sell in his shop.</p>	
	<p>On the afternoon of the 8.1.81 Mr. Bull called at the Bedser home in Merrylands to collect some property of his and was talking with the deceased's wife mother and she told BULL that the deceased had come home on Christmas Eve, 1979, in a very distressed state and refused to discuss anything with his mother. Bull then remembered that on that same day he was returning home from work and got off the train at Merrylands and was walking through the Merrylands Arcade, Merrylands Road, Merrylands when he noticed some T shirts in the window and was going to buy one of them for a Christmas present for his wife. He went into the store, which is next to the boot repairer in that arcade, and selected the T shirt and then he saw a man, behind the counter speaking on the telephone to some person. The man was agitated and raised his voice into the phone and he kept on repeating, "John, I did not threaten your mother." Bull was in this shop for five minutes and the man remained speaking on the telephone and was annoyed with the other party to the telephone conversation.</p>	
	<p>Bull was then served by a woman who was in the shop also. She was listening to the conversation of the man and did not pay much attention to Bull. Bull then left the shop. Bull had occasion to call into the same shop recently and he saw the same man and woman in the shop that he saw on Christmas eve 1979.2</p>
