	<p>About 6.45pm on 12/1/81, attended [REDACTED] and interviewed [REDACTED] 137 [REDACTED] 137, born [REDACTED] concerning the BEDSER inquiry. [REDACTED] 137 in mentioned in R/S 87 as being an associate of the deceased. The interview was done in the presence of his mother. Home Telephone. [REDACTED] (Answering Service) and [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] 137 is employed as a carpet layer at Simons Carpets, Burrows Road, St Peters. Phone. [REDACTED] He is not known at the Fingerprints.</p> <p>[REDACTED] 137 stated that he first met BEDSER about 2½ years ago after visiting the deceased shop, looking for old firearms. The [REDACTED] 137 family has an extensive collection of old firearms particularly muzzle loaders, rifles, shotguns and pistols. He was then asked to help the deceased at the shop after School, and was paid by the hour. He stopped associating with the deceased about 12 months ago. Whilst [REDACTED] 137 was working at the Antique Shop, his parents separated. [REDACTED] 137 lived in [REDACTED] and came to know [REDACTED] NP58 and [REDACTED] 147, who were also associates of the deceased. He stated that he knew that [REDACTED] NP58 was stealing both money and jewellery from the deceased's shop. He suggests that [REDACTED] 147, although he may have been aware of what [REDACTED] NP58 was doing, wasn't involved. [REDACTED] 137 says that he knows that [REDACTED] NP58 sold two gold chains that he had stolen from the shop for \$200-00 each, but was unable to say who purchased them. This information came from the deceased. [REDACTED] 137 stated that he had travelled to various contry centres with the deceased in the course of the Antique business, to places such as Canberra, Goulburn, Katoomba and around the picton area. He states that he last saw the deceased about 4 weeks prior to his death, at the shop when they talked about a red car that the deceased was going to buy. BEDSER produced a photograph of this car which showed [REDACTED] NP58 standing next to it. This car was ordered from Melbourne.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">continued.....</p>

	<p>When questioned about his knowledge of [REDACTED] I36, ([REDACTED]) I37 suggested that the deceased went out with him on at least two occasions.</p>	
	<p>I37 stated that he is not a homosexual and didn't have any sexual relations with the deceased, although he had been asked by BEDSER to participate in same. I37 stated that his father found out that BEDSER was a homosexual about 12 months ago. An argument followed between them when Mr. I37's father told BEDSER to keep away from his son. This argument is said to have taken place at the I37's family home.</p>	
	<p>I37 had a large scar on his left hand. He stated that he cut his hand whilst cutting carpet at his place of employment on 1/12/80 and was treated at Royal Prince Alfred Hospital where 5 sutures were inserted in the wound.</p>	
	<p>I37 was asked if he knew a woman or girl named [REDACTED] or 'Tina', that used to frequent the deceased's shop. He stated that a friend of [REDACTED] was called [REDACTED] who he described as being about 16 old, attractive, with a well developed chest. (See R/S 85/4-8)</p>	
	<p>I37 also relates an incident when NP58 and others took BEDSER's car without his consent. BEDSER found out about it and fronted NP58, who was going to throw the ignition keys down a toilet at a pin ball parlour at Parramatta. They argued. I47 was also involved in this incident. This incident is said to have occurred after BEDSER found out about NP58 selling some of his chains.</p>	
	<p>According to I37, NP58 had some \$4,000-00 in a bank account when he was associating with BEDSER. I37 was unable to give any other details.</p>	
	<p>I37 stated that BEDSER used to park his car at a garage at the back of some shops in Darcy Street</p>

	<p>somewhere near the Dry Cleaning Shop and used to pay the owners a few dollars per week for the use of same.</p>	
	<p>[REDACTED] 137 also suggests that the deceased was friendly with members of the Hell's Angels Motor Cycle group, mainly through the fact that they used to purchase their requisites through him eg. German Helmets, medals, etc. He mentioned that BEDSER visited a number of these persons in the Merrylands area, and mentioned the name "ROSCOE" as being one of them. At one stage, some of these Hells Angels lived in his home next door at [REDACTED].</p>	
	<p>[REDACTED] 137 suggests that [REDACTED] 147 [REDACTED] 147 knew the deceased better than anyone. He was very close to him and [REDACTED] 137 suggests that BEDSER confided in [REDACTED] 147, [REDACTED] 137 suggests that [REDACTED] 147 was at the shop shortly after the murder.</p>	
	<p>[REDACTED] 137 was shown the Penry of the suspect. He was unable to assist as to its identity.</p>	
	<p>Notwithstanding [REDACTED] 137 claim he wasn't involved in homosexual activities, there is no doubt that he was and was receiving money from BEDSER for services rendered in that regard.</p>
