19/12/80	<p>Mr. BRUCE MACDONALD , SOLICITOR <u>INTERVIEWED RE THE DECEASED</u></p>	TREBLEY/ALLCORN
	<p>On the 18/12/80, attended premises of Macdonald and Edgerton, Solicitors, 48 Macquarie Street, Parramatta, after Mr. Bruce Macdonald, had contacted this station and advised us that he was in possession of a tape recording made by the deceased, between the deceased and Mrs. NP59 on the 11/6/80.</p>	
	<p>We interviewed Mr. Macdonald and he stated that on the 12/6/80 the deceased had written him a letter enclosing a cassette tape recording which the deceased had made from a hidden recorder in his shop, between himself and Mrs. NP59, in which he fronts Mrs. NP59 over some money owed him by her. The tape runs for 45 minutes and is mainly Mrs. NP59 raving on about the money and the deceased trying to reason with her.</p>	
	<p>Mr. Macdonald stated that the deceased requested him to write a letter of demand on the NP59 family for two outstanding debts, one of \$220.00 being the balance left from a loan of \$2,900.00 he had given to NP58 and the other debt of \$300.00 which he had given direct to Mrs. NP59 for her sick father in Greece (which Mr. NP60 knew nothing about).</p>	
	<p>Mr. Macdonald stated that the NP59 family did nothing about the letter of demand, so on 24/7/80 he caused two xxxx small debt summons to be issued at the Parramatta Court of Petty Sessions. These were served by the Bailiff on 25/7/80 and later the same date the deceased contacted Mr. Macdonald and stated that he had come to an agreement with the family and would Mr. Macdonald take no further action and send him a bill for what he had done. Mr. Macdonald did this and thought no more about the matter until the death of Bedser. He then perused the file again and realised that he was still in possession of the tape.</p>	
	<p>Mr. Macdonald gave Police the tape and also copies of three letters written by the deceased for our records.</p>
