

## STATUTORY DECLARATION

do solemnly and sincerely declare as follows:

On Saturday 27th September  
1980 my friend **[redacted] NP58** came to my home in his yellow escort at about 7.45PM - then drove me to Belfield RSL club where we arrived at about 8.30PM. There was only the two of us in the vehicle.

**NP58** parked - locked the vehicle in the street because there was no room in the car park.

We met friends inside the club where we attended a disco until about 12.30AM. In all there would have been about 15 people we knew at the disco.

It was the first time either **NP58** or myself attended the RSL club as we usually attend the Belfield Bowling Club's disco.

When we left the club at about 12.30AM **NP58** and myself walked to where he had parked his car only to find it was missing. We then walked back to our friends to tell them that same car had been stolen. We all walked around looking for **NP58** for 10-15 minutes

And I make this solemn declaration conscientiously believing the same to be true and by virtue

of the provisions of the "Oaths Act 1900."

The police told us to come down to the station - report the fact no Louis Mantzos drove us down in his vehicle & from the police station home.

The people besides **147** that were in his vehicle was his sister, a fellow I knew as **NP58**, myself - **NP58**

I have no knowledge who stole the vehicle. I am sure **NP58** had nothing to do with its destruction. In fact I don't believe **NP58** is the type of person who would consider an act such as happened.

The vehicle in my opinion, was average to just above average. To my knowledge the only problem he had had with it was an oil bath.

**NP58** had not mentioned that he had any intentions of selling the vehicle
