The patient stated that he was allergic to Stemetil tablets which had caused muscular spasms when taken in the past, and he also stated that he had had Maxolon tablets previously without

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problem. Provisional diagnosis was made of nausea due to medication of female hormones, and anti nausea tablets Maxolon 10mg and Pyridoxine (Vitamin B6) were prescribed.

6. The patient represented to the surgery the following day still complaining of nausea, and having taken medication of Maxolon one tablet twice daily, and Pyridoxine three tablets per day, he was issued a medical certificate for three days off work and was not seen again. He was informed to continue the anti nausea medication. Physical examination at the time was normal. The patient did not complain of injury and had no abnormal physical signs. On the second visit the patient did tell me that he had stopped his hormone tablets because his nausea was thought to be caused by the tablets.

7. I have seen the patient on a number of times over the last few years walking in Kensington. This was the first and only time I have treated this patient.
