(1) I am aware that if I sign this statement and any part of this statement is untrue to my knowledge I may be liable to punishment.

(2) My date of birth is the [Redacted] 1952.

(3) I have lived at the above address for approximately two and a half years. It is a two bedroom flat situated in a three storey block with 11 flats.

(4) In flat number [Redacted], which is directly across the hallway from my flat, to my knowledge, two people live there. I last saw these two people on Easter Sunday. On that occasion I pulled up outside the building and I saw that there were a number of bikes parked outside. There was a party going on inside the flat and I saw the blonde haired person that lived in the flat towards the back of the flat.

(5) I would describe this blonde person as being: About 6 feet tall, I think it is a transexual, mid 30's, slim build, bleached blonde hair to the shoulder, straight hair, she wore a lot of make up and had a rough complexion,

I would describe the second one as being: brownish coloured hair, shorter than the first one, I can't remember her apart from that. She looked to be a transexual.

(6) These two people have been at the premises for about 6 to 8 months. The past tenant knew the two of them. The past tenant Carmen RUPE. She is a maori woman that works in the Kings Cross area.

(7) On Sunday the 28th of April, 1985 I spent the day at home. I started watching the golf about 3.30pm, and between 3.30pm and 5pm, I think it would be about 4pm I heard a sharp crack. I thought that it was a car back firing or a gun, but I thought it was a car back firing. It was a very loud noise and it sounded like it was just outside the window. I have been to a rifle range and I have heard rifles being fired, but this didn't sound like a rifle. I thought that it may be a gunshot but it seemed so unlikely I put it out of my mind.

(8) I didn't leave my flat on that day so I didn't see any people that were suspicious. Since Sunday I was home on Monday to about mid-day. I then went out and I returned about 3.30pm. About 8.30pm on Monday I again left and returned about 10pm. Since Sunday I have not heard any sounds similar.


(9) I declare that no part of this statement is untrue to my knowledge. I know that it may be used in legal proceedings. It accurately sets out the evidence that I would be prepared to give in Court as a witness, if necessary.
