- I am a transexual prostitute and I reside at the above address with I have worked in Premier Lane, Darlinghurst, for the past 16 months. Prior to that I worked in shows at various clubs.
- I have known Wendy for the past 5 years after meeting her at the Rex Hotel. Since I have known her I have seen her at a plant shop in Crown Street which she used to own and at her home and at Pete's Beat Club and I got to know her fairly well. I know that she has been living in Darlinghurst Road for the past three months and I have visited her on a number of occasions. She lived at this address by herself and I am not aware of any persons who ever stayed there.
- About 3-15am on Monday, 29 April, 1985, I walked into Premier Lane from the Darlinghurst Road end when a light blue Holden Kingswwod sedan approached me. Wendy got out of the car and I saw a person who I only know as Bill was driving the car. Wendy asked me if it was busy and then two cars came into Premier Lane from the Forbes Street entrance. Wendy walked towards the cars and I walked the other way. As I was walking up Premier Lane I saw a male leaning against the rail. I would describe this person as being about 22 to 26 years old, about 5'9" tall, medium build, medium complexion, dark collar length straight brown hair and he was wearing blue scraggy jeans and a black T-shirt which had a design on it. I noticed that he had a stud earring in his left ear which was silver. He approached me and asked me how much I charge and I told him. He said, "Do you have a car?" I said, "No". He then asked me if I had a room. I told him that I didn't and that he would have to pay extra money. I told him that he probably didn't have any money anyway and he then reached into his pocket and pulled out some money which consisted of a \$50-00 note. It was then that I saw that this person had a tattoo on the back of his left hand which went down to his middle finger. I am not sure what the tattoo was but I thought it might have been a crucifix. He said that he didn't want to pay for a room and asked me if there was any of the other
