1. This statement made by me accurately sets out the evidence that I would be prepared, if necessary, to give in court as a witness. The statement is true to the best of my knowledge and belief and I make it knowing that, if it is tendered in evidence, I will be liable to prosecution if I have wilfully stated in it anything that I know to be false, or do not believe to be true.

- 2. I am 38 years of age.
- 3. I am a Detective Sergeant in the Homicide Squad of the New South Wales Police Force (NSWPF). I am currently a Team Leader within the Unsolved Homicide Team (UHT).
- 4. As part of my role, I am assisting the NSWPF in responding to requests issued by the Special Commission of Inquiry into LGBTIQ Hate Crimes (Inquiry).
- 5. I make this statement in respect of:
 - a) Summons NSWPF10 issued by the Inquiry to the Commissioner of the NSWPF (Commissioner) dated 24 August 2022 with a return date of 7 September 2022 (Summons 10);
 - b) Summons NSWPF46 issues by the Inquiry to the Commissioner dated 20 December 2022 with a return date of 17 January 2023 (**Summons 46**); and

6. I make this statement on the basis of information known to me and information provided to me

by colleagues in the NSWPF and believe that information to be true at the time of making this

statement.

7. The Inquiry's Letter requested that the NSWPF provide a statement in respect of the searches

undertaken in response to Summons 10 to locate the exhibit book references and EFIMS

records of the Exhibits and the searches undertaken in response to Summons 46. I deal with

these separately below.

Summons 10

8. Summons 10 requested the production of exhibits associated with the death of Wendy Waine

on 29 or 30 April 1985. Those exhibits being:

a) strands of hair found in the left hand of the deceased;

b) six cigarette butts;

c) bed linen, including pillow, bed spread and sheeting; and

d) fired bullets.

together referred to as Exhibits.

9. The NSWPF has conducted the following enquiries to locate the Exhibits:

a) Searches of the NSWPF exhibit management system - Exhibits Forensic Information

and Miscellaneous Property System (EFIMS) were conducted. The EFIMS system

catalogues exhibits maintained by NSWPF. Only one exhibit was recorded (discussed

in more detail at paragraph 10 and following below) (Bedsheet):

Searches of all NSWPF investigative holdings - WebCOPS, Historical COPS Data, Preb) COPS data, E@glei and KODA ('Google' Style Search Engine across NSWPF systems) were reviewed. No records of the Exhibits were located as a result of these searches.

- Enquiries were made with the Kings Cross Police Area Command (PAC) (which c) encompasses the Darlinghurst Police Station which I understand conducted the original investigation). The exhibits unit at Kings Cross PAC advised that all exhibits stored at Kings Cross PAC are recorded on EFIMS and all exhibit books have been archived. As no results were returned following a search of EFMIS apart from the Bedsheet (see paragraph 9a) above) I understand that the other Exhibits are not stored at Kings Cross PAC.
- Enquires were made with NSWPF Records and Information Management Unit d) (Archives) to locate exhibit books used at Darlinghurst Police Station. Exhibit books were issued with an individual number, similar to a serial number which is unique to that particular book. The NSWPF refers to these types of books as "accountable books". Due to the development of EFIMS, exhibit books are no longer used by the NSWPF. All accountable books are stored and maintained by Archives. Requests were made to locate the exhibit book for Darlinghurst Police Station for April 1985 which I understand would have recorded information relating to the Exhibits' movements and examination/analysis. Archives confirmed that no records to the exhibit book for the Darlinghurst Police Station for April 1985 exist.
- I understand at the time of the investigation, the Darlinghurst Police Station could also e) have stored exhibits at what was referred to as "Central Exhibits"; which was a storage location for all Police Stations within the Sydney Central Business District area to secure exhibits. My understanding is Central Exhibits was originally located at Central Police Station at 7-9 Central Street, Sydney but later moved to the Sydney Police Centre at 151-241 Goulburn St, Surry Hills. Exhibit books for the time period of April 1985 located at Central Exhibits were reviewed however, there were no records of the Exhibits.

f) Enquiries were made with Forensic Evidence & Technical Services (FETS). FETS maintains the exhibit and exhibit records for cold cases and works closely with UHT on cold cases. Senior Sergeant Anne COADY, Coordinator - Cold Case, DNA Management Unit is the contact point for UHT within FETS for these types of requests and after conducting searches of FETS systems confirmed no Exhibits or records of the

Exhibits could be located.

g) Enquiries were made with Dr David BRUCE, Senior Forensic Biologist for the NSW Forensic and Analytical Science Service (FASS). FASS's role is to test exhibits during the conduct of investigations. In some instances, exhibits are not returned to NSWPF but are rather retained by FASS whether that be for further testing or other reasons. Dr BRUCE is the contact point for UHT within FASS for these types of requests and after conducting searches of FASS systems confirmed no record of samples similar to the

Exhibits were located in the exhibit register.

10. In respect of the Bedsheet, a review of the crime scene photographs indicate that this is a fragment of a flannelette bedsheet which was over the bed at the crime scene. Photographs of the bedsheet and the crime scene photos indicating the location of the bedsheet are attached

to this statement and marked "A".

11. Records indicate that the Bedsheet was stored with Ballistics Investigation Section (Ballistics) and was allocated a job number of "85/267". There is no information as to why the Bedsheet was stored at Ballistics. Typically, the only exhibits stored at Ballistics are firearms, ammunition or other weapons. Ballistics is not generally used for long-term storage of exhibits. Exhibits are generally only retained at Ballistics whilst being examined after which the exhibit is returned to the station who has carriage of the investigation. There is no record of what

examination/s were conducted on the Bedsheet.

12. Records indicate the Bedsheet was identified when the Ballistics unit moved from Zetland to the Sydney Police Centre in 2016. The Bedsheet was subsequently entered into the EFIMS

system and moved to long-term exhibit storage at the Metropolitan Exhibit and Property Centre

. Enquiries were subsequently made with Archives who confirmed that the
Personnel File for Constable NP177 – Registered Number was
destroyed in 2011.
b) Category 1(b) - Professional Standards Command file: Enquiries were made with
Detective Chief Inspector Neil SNOWDEN, Professional Standards Manager - State
Crime Command who confirmed there is no records recorded against Constable NP177
NP177 – Registered Number in the IAPro - Complaint and Employee
Management Information System (CEMIS). The CEMIS is the central records database
for all NSWPF employees. Further searches were conducted on variations of the name
NP177 however there were no records located.
c) <u>Category 2(a) - Firearms registry records - NP179</u> Enquiries were made with Colin
Green, Manager, Compliance and Enforcement of the NSWPF Firearms registry. NP179
NP179 is not recorded on the Integrated Licensing System (ILS) which is a system
used to record firearms licensing. However, a search on the Central Licencing Database
(CLD) recorded that NP179 applied for a one-year licence on 15 September
1989 which was subsequently issued on 26/09/1989 with an expiry date of 26
September 1990. There is no other information available as to the type of licence issued
because only basic data is kept in relation to the CLD following its decommissioning and
replacement by the ILS in 1985.
I consider the above searches and enquiries to be an exhaustive search for the items
described in Categories 1(a), 1(b) and 2(a) of Summons 46 and that no further avenues of
