

Case 71 - BASIC OVERVIEW OF MILLER

Date of Note: 18 Jan 2016
Brief Description: Death of Scott Stuart MILLER (DOB: 27/07/1975 - aged 21 years) between 02/03/1997 - 03/03/1997. MILLER's body was located at the bottom of a 7 metre cliff at Wharf 5, Hickson Road Darling Harbour, within the machinery yard of the business "Patricks Stevedoring".

MILLER suffered severe head and internal injuries caused by being hit with a blunt object or falling from a height.

MILLER was in the city watching the Mardi Gra with friends. He was well intoxicated. He attended the Observer Hotel and being intoxicated was requested to leave the Hotel which he did.

He was last seen by his friend Shawn KELLY about 1.30am on Sunday 2 March 1997 in the vicinity of the Orient Hotel (where he and his friend were headed after being asked to leave The Observer Hotel).

A local resident Ms Jade CARTER believes she saw MILLER about 2.10am close to the Sydney Observatory.

MILLER's body was later located about 7.30am on Monday 3 March 1997.

This case remains unsolved.

NOTE: In 1999, [NP130] (DOB: [REDACTED]) came under police attention when he was charged (and later convicted) for the murder of [I304] (Case [REDACTED]).

[NP130] was linked to the death of Scott MILLER as he made certain statements in relation to harming a male person in The Rocks area of Sydney in 1997.

[NP130] was never charged in relation to the death of MILLER as subsequent investigations did not bring forth any evidence suggesting he was involved in the death of MILLER - although to what extent these investigations went to is unknown).

Also, in early 1997 a social worker overheard a young inmate of Mount Penang Juvenile Centre talking about throwing a male from a cliff in The Rocks area. When questioned about the male, the inmate laughed off his previous statement. It is not known if this was further investigated.
