Death turns to murder

THE death of a former security guard in his Surry Hills unit last week became a murder hunt yesterday hunt yesterday when police discovwas he ered bludgeoned before he died.

William Meek, 51, was
found lying dead in the
hallway of his unit in
Belvoir St last
Wednesday afternoon.
A post mortem on
his body revealed several blows to the head
with a blunt instrument, police said.

Police and Meek's 26year-old daughter. Wendy Griffin, said they could think of no motive. Ms Griffin, a sales

consultant, said her father was a "very kind and generous man who helped a lot of people".

She said Meek, who lived alone, had "worked tirelessly" to help his community.

He had also worked as a volunteer for local Independent MP Clover Moore.
"There is no reason

"There is no reason why anyone would want to kill him," said Ms Griffin, the youngest of Meek's three children.
"Please, if anyone who knows anything, and thousany him he

or if they saw him before it happened, just tell Surry Hills police."

A reward of \$1000 would be offered by Crimestoppers to crimestoppers to anyone who gave infor-mation that led to an arrest, Detective Ser-geant Tony Tanos said.
