Narrative of circumstances under which death took place.

The deceased was found naked, laying on the lounge room floor of the unit in which he lived with his friend, NP215, at approx. 5.20pm on the 12.6.1995. He had been stabbed numerous times to the torso, both front and back, and had lacerations to the face and head, and there was a large quantity of blood in the bedroom, bathroom, kitchen, hallway, and on the floor. The scene has been examined by Detectives, Crime Scene, Photogrametry, Fingerprints and attended by the Mediaal Officer. Body temperature was 23 deg, room temp 15 deg at time of taking. It is obvious the deceased has been attacked in the unit and died from his wounds. Found laying on his left side, with his head to the Southern aspect of the room. Injuries to his head/face area consistent with being hit with an object similar to a frypan which was found in the bedroom. Doors to the unit were apparently left locked when the friend returned home, he stating he had to undo the deadlock on the front door to gain access to the unit. ENQUIRIES CONTINUING.

If any previous illness, and deceased seen by doctor, particulars should be given. Where treated by a doctor a note should be obtained giving particulars of treatment of such doctor. If died within 24 hours of Anaesthetic - Forms A and B required from hospital and indicated at the start of the Narrative.
