home in Sydney when he had been here on official business.

- 6. I knew both Ken and his partner NP215 were in a homosexual relationship. NP215 was also employed at the Open High School on my recommendation. My partner and myself socialised with them on a number of occasions. We visited them in the flat at Elizabeth Bay on one occasion. I knew that Ken and NP215 had an open relationship and that Ken saw other gay men whereas NP215 did not. The last time I saw Ken was on Friday afternoon at school at approximately 3.30pm. On this occasion Ken I believe left school on time even though he often stayed back to work on the computer.
- 7. To my knowledge Ken had no enemies whatsoever. He was much admired by his work colleagues and his many students. He was always very professional in his dealing with myself, other colleagues and his many students.
