1. This statement made by me accurately sets out the evidence which I would be prepared, if necessary, to give in court as a witness. The statement is true to the best of my knowledge and belief and I make it knowing that, if it is tendered in evidence, I shall be liable to prosecution if I have wilfully stated in it anything which I know to be false or do not believe to be true.

2. My age is 29

3. I work as a Taxi driver with my brother, Mahanna NADDAF, driving taxi registration number [REDACTED]. I hold a current Department of Transport Taxi Drivers Licence No. [REDACTED]. Whenever I work in the taxi my Licence card is displayed on the front dashboard of the car and can be viewed by the passengers. The card displays my Taxi Licence No. [REDACTED].

4. My brother owns the taxi [REDACTED] which is a [REDACTED] sedan, [REDACTED] model. The taxi is white in colour and has a Taxi Combined sticker on both the drivers door and the front passengers door. The back seat is a bench which can seat three people and the front has two bucket seats. The taxi can carry four passengers.

5. On Saturday, 10 June, 1995, I started working between 4.30pm and 5.00pm from my brothers home at [REDACTED] Campsie. I finished my shift around 2.30am-3.00am on 11 June,

1995, and drove the taxi to my home.


6. During the evening of 10 June, 1995, I was working in the City area. I recall that at about 8.00pm to 9.00pm I picked up two men from in the vicinity of McLay Street, Kings Cross. I recall that one of the men got into the front passenger seat and the other got into the back seat and sat behind the other male. The male that got into the front got in and said, "Woollahra", I said, "Whereabouts in Woollahra?, Queen Street or Ocean Street", the male in the front said, "Take us to Queen Street and we'll show you from there". The male in the back seat didn't say anything at all.

7. I then started to drive south up Darlinghurst Road towards Oxford Street. When I reached Oxford Street I turned left and drove through Paddington and left into Queen Street at Paddington. When I turned left I asked the male, "Whereabouts now, where your street is?", he said, "I don't know, you are the driver you have got a license to drive, you take us to the street", I said, "All right you just tell me what the street name", he turned to his friend in the back and said, "What is the street name", I stopped the car in the gutter. I turned to the male in the back and he told me a street name and also handed me a piece of paper with the street number, street name and Woollahra. I don't remember the name now, however, I can indicate the street to you if I am supplied with a street directory.





I was driving in the street I said, "What's your number?", the male in the front indicated a large block of units on my right. I saw that there was a driveway that I could drive off the street and closer to the front door. I asked the man in the front if he wanted me to drive in and he said yes. I then drove in, and turned off the meter. The meter said that the cost of the fare was \$8.00. The male in the front said, "We usually pay \$6.00", I said, "Look it wasn't my fault, first you told me Queen, I found the street". The man in the front gave me a \$10.00 note and I handed him back a \$2.00 coin. He said, "Thank you very much" and left the taxi. The male in the front also got out of the cab and both walked off towards the units. The man that was in the front seemed to be the boss and always gave the orders.

8. The man in the front was bigger than the man in the back. The man in the front was fat around the belly area. He was older than the man in the back. The man in the front was holding a paper bag, and it looked like a bottle, like the shape of a wine bottle, was inside the bag. The man in the front was looking at his watch about three times whilst I was driving. It seemed that he might be running late. Whilst I was driving the man in the front had a pen in his hand.
