1. This statement made by me accurately sets out the evidence which I would be prepared, if necessary, to give in court as a witness. The statement is true to the best of my knowledge and belief and I make it knowing that, if it is tendered in evidence, I shall be liable to prosecution if I have wilfully stated anything which I know to be false or do not believe to be true.
2. I am 28 years of age.
3. About 8.30am on Sunday the 11th of June, 1995 I started work at [REDACTED] where I have been employed as a Gallery Manager for the last six years. About 1.00pm my sister Olivia met me after work, we had lunch and then went to a movie. About 8.00pm Olivia and I returned to my place and we made dinner and watched T.V for a while.
4. About 11.00pm my sister went to bed and I stayed up as I was filling out an application form and I was also waiting for the Rugby to start.
5. Whilst I was in my loungeroom I was sitting at the dining room table and I looked out the window. This window overlooks the area where Onslow Avenue meets Elizabeth Bay Road.
6. Between about 11.00pm and 11.20pm, whilst looking through

the window I saw a guy pacing back and forwards and I also saw him light a cigarette. At this time the guy was on the corner of Onslow Avenue and Elizabeth Bay Road. At this time the area was not really well lit and the street light there turns everything orange. I noticed that the guy appeared very nervous and he couldn't keep still. He kept crossing over Onslow Avenue. I watched him for about a minute or two. The guy looked up and saw me so I turned away and continued with my application form. During this time I could still see him through the corner of my eye. I then turned around and had another look and I saw that he was still looking up at me.

7. I then returned to the form and at this time I felt nervous as the guy really freaked me out. A short while later I again looked out the window and I saw that this guy was gone.

8. To the best of my recollection I would describe this guy as being about 5'8"; shaggy longish hair which was unkempt, maybe light brown in colour; he was in his mid to late thirties; of average build; he walked normally; he was wearing jeans; a shirt and a jacket over the top of the shirt.

9. I thought nothing further about this incident until I realised that the man that was killed in Onslow Avenue was actually killed on Sunday night, and not on Monday as I had initially thought. On Wednesday night, 14th June, 1995 I pieced together that fact that the man I thought suspicious was in the area on the same night that the man was killed.

10. On Thursday the 15th of June, 1995 I rang the Kings Cross Detectives Office where I spoke with Detective TAYLER. On Saturday the 24th of June, 1995 I attended the Kings Cross
