The information contained in the case file from the original examination of the condom in 1995 does not clarify whether the 'outside' surface of the condom refers to 'as received' or 'as worn'. It is probably more likely that the condom was examined 'as received' with 'outside' and 'inside' distinguishing the samples taken from the outside surface and the inside surface. When the condom was re-examined in 2016 it is noted that the samples were taken from the outside and inside surfaces as received.

- 5. Does FASS have access to DNA databases within New Zealand? If not, please outline the steps that the Inquiry should take to ensure a specific DNA profile has been checked against any existing New Zealand DNA database.
- 6. If possible, please identify the medium (i.e. blood, semen, saliva etc) of each of the DNA profiles referred to at: (a) item 36i; and (b) item 37ii of paragraph 4 of your expert certificate dated 8 September 2023.
