1. I am a gardener employed by the Drummoyne Municipal Council and have been for the last 3 years.

2. On Monday the 27th September, 1976., I walked from Great North Road, Five Dock to the Five Dock Park, Park Road, Five Dock to commence my days work in the grounds of the park. I arrived at the Park about 5 minutes to 7.00am, and immediately opened the ladies toilets, which are on the park side of the football field grand-stand. I then walked around to the front of the grandstand and opened up the dressing shed gates. I went down the stairs leading to the dressing rooms and opened the two dressing rooms. I put my bag inside one of them and walked out of the dressing sheds and up and around the Barnstaple Road end of the park and opened up the mens toilet on that side of the grandstand, and I saw this dog which is always at the park running back and forth near the steps leading up to the grandstand seats. I walked over to the stairs and saw blood on the steps. I looked up the top of the grandstand and saw a man on the top of the stairs lying there on his back with a knife in his stomach.

3. I got scared and started to run to the Five Dock Police Station and I saw one of the other fellows who also works at the park, Wally Bayly coming along and I told him what I had seen. We both then went to the Police Station and told the Police there what I had seen. We both then went in the Police car to the Park and I showed the Policemen the body of the man on the grandstand walkway.
