I am a pensioner and I reside at the above address.

I am a member of the Western Suburbs Soccer Club, William Street, Five Dock and I have been a member of that Club for the past four years approximately.

Last Sunday afternoon between 5pm and 5.30pm, that is 26th September, 1976, I went to the Western Suburbs Soccer Club, William Street, Five Dock. When I arrived there I went to the Auditorium of the Club where I met some friends of mine, Mrs. Daisy Mann of \_\_\_\_\_ Five Dock, Mr and Mrs. Pemberton of either \_\_\_\_\_ or \_\_\_\_\_ Concord and Mr and Mrs Brown of Concord, but I don't know their address. I sat at a table with these persons and played cards, euchre, until about 6.15pm when we went and had tea. After tea I went and sat at a table with two of my friends, a Mrs. Worland of \_\_\_\_\_ Ashfield and a Mr. John Murphy of Concord West, I don't know the address. I sat talking with these two persons, and I think they might have left the table to play the Poker Machines. With a Mrs. Moller, and Mrs Worland and Mr. Murphy, I watched the show when it started. We left the club before the show finished, that is Mrs. Worland, Mr. Murphy and myself. We walked out the front entrance of the club and stood at the front of the club talking for a few minutes. As we walked out the door of the club, I saw a man who I know as Barry Jones standing in a slightly bent fashion as he has done in the past when he is drunk. I have known Barry Jones for about two years and I have seen him in the Western Suburbs Soccer Club on other occasions and I was introduced to him by a man I know, Mr. Harry Minter, who sometimes stays at my home. Prior to leaving the club, I had seen him in the club and he appeared to be drunk but I am unable to say what part of the club I saw him in. When I saw Barry Jones, I said to Mr. Murphy and Mrs. Worland, "Look at Barry Jones, doesn't he look awful". One of them said, "Who is Barry Jones"? I said, "That chap there". John Murphy said to me, "Are you right to get home then"? I said, "Yes, he is harmless". We stayed there for a few minutes and

while we were there a taxi drove up to the kerb in front of the club from the direction of Lyons Road, Five Dock. The taxi stopped out the front of the club and I heard Barry Jones say something to the driver in a loud voice and then he stumbled to the taxi and he put his hands on the taxi and he then got into the front passengers seat of the taxi. A short time later the taxi drove away. The taxi drove away from the front of the club with Barry Jones in it round about 10.30pm.

I am unable to describe the driver of the taxi or the taxi or what company the taxi was from. When the taxi pulled up at the front of the club as far as I know, there was no person other than the driver in the vehicle. Barry Jones was the only other person to enter the taxi prior to it driving away from the club. The driver of the taxi did not at any time get out of the taxi whilst I was watching.

When I remarked to Mr. Murphy and Mrs. Worland about Barry Jones looking awful, I was referring to his condition so far as being drunk was concerned.
